President's Message

One of the aims and objectives of the Trent Valley Quilters' Guild as stated in our constitution is to "encourage participation in charitable endeavours". Our charity of choice is Comfort Quilts.

I've been a guild member for nearly seven years but must confess that until recently I had never attended a Comfort Quilts meeting. I've devoted some time at home to stitching binding on a couple of quilts and last summer I met the challenge to make a quilt from scratch, but that's not much of a record for seven years of membership. My excuses over the years have included the following:

- * I'm a new guild member and I don't know anyone who goes to Comfort Quilts.
- * It's too far to drive from Campbellford.
- * My sewing machine is too heavy.
- * Those Comfort Quilts ladies have it all under control and don't need me.
- * I have too much personal sewing to do.
- * Those ladies are excellent quilters and my skills are no match for theirs.

When I decided to write about Comfort Quilts I knew that I needed to experience at least one meeting. So on November 21st I packed up my lunch and that heavy sewing machine and headed for Frankford United Church. The church is easy to find, right on Mill Street up from the bridge and there's plenty of parking in the rear. I arrived at 9 am and already several members were busy setting up tables and putting out bins and bags of fabric. I received a warm welcome and lots of explanation about how the day would proceed. As more and more ladies arrived there were happy greetings and much laughter and I knew this would be a great time. Coffee and treats were available and the participants chatted together as they worked, but the emphasis was on creating quilts.

There were jobs for all interests and skill levels. Some volunteers were piecing tops and applying borders, some were pressing and layering and others were quilting. I learned that there is a particular need for volunteers to quilt tops. Lots of assistance is available and there's really no better way to practice your free motion quilting than on a piece that doesn't have to be absolutely perfect. Helen Fujiki, a local quilter and teacher, says that we must devote 300 hours to free motion work in order to become proficient and a Comfort Quilts meeting is an opportunity to reach that goal.

As we all know, quilting is not an inexpensive hobby. Comfort Quilts receives many donations of fabric for tops. However, large pieces for backing, along with batting and spray, must be purchased. It is estimated that the cost of these items runs about \$70.00 for large quilts and \$35.00 to \$40.00 for smaller quilts. Monetary donations are sometimes received but cannot be relied upon. Therefore, there is provision in our guild budget for the purchase of these items and every effort is made to take advantage of sale prices.

Joy Forge, Marion Payette and Marilyn Edmonds are passionate supporters of Comfort Quilts and really are the lifeblood of the program. They are the members who report to us at our monthly guild meetings. They keep the program running by purchasing supplies, receiving, sorting and laundering donated fabrics, storing all of this in their homes and transporting everything in bins and bags to the two monthly Comfort Quilts meetings. They are also responsible for distributing the completed quilts, which they report is an extremely satisfying experience. Their contribution of time and energy is boundless.

After many years as chairperson of Comfort Quilts, Joy stepped down from her position last June, although she and Marion are devoted to this cause and will continue to participate and assist. Marilyn has agreed to assume the position of interim chairperson until a volunteer steps forward. This has not happened. It is possible that without a volunteer to assume this position Comfort Quilts may not be sustainable in its current form. At last count there are over 150 guild members. I am asking one or two of you to step forward and chair this most worthwhile of all committees. In the meantime, the need for quilts will continue. Last year 180 quilts were distributed. If each member would agree to make one quilt per year, either at home or at Comfort Quilts, we would be close to meeting our needs. As we move into 2014 let's adopt a new guild slogan:

“EACH ONE MAKE ONE”

By the way, I plan to attend another Comfort Quilts meeting very soon. To quote Marilyn Edmonds, “it’s a place where friendships are made and lessons are learned”.

As I write this message, Christmas is fast approaching. I hope you will all take time to enjoy the sights, sounds and special events of the season, which I have learned are sometimes better than “the big day” itself. For some, personal circumstances can make the holidays a challenging time. To you I send a special wish for peace and happiness. To all of you I wish the many joys of the season.
