Quilt Show 2023

I am very pleased to report that committee chair positions are filled! And organization is starting to pick up momentum.

A theme has been suggested for the show, and that theme is The Butterfly Effect. This is Hattie Van Dyk's idea. Summarizing how she described it, "...the idea that a small event can have far-reaching and long-term effects for future events. Thinking about our Guild and the "small" things we do, as a collective and as individuals: comfort quilts, place mats, preemie blankets, blocks or quilts for a cause, or as a particular comfort after a traumatic event--these are just some of the examples of our "small" efforts rippling out into the community and far beyond. As we do what we love to do, we also bring joy and comfort to so many. One person's joy becomes contagious, and spreads to everyone they meet! It can change someone's day, someone's outlook, someone's heart. And once that happens, who can predict what good may grow!"

Isn't this an absolutely lovely idea?? Hattie also made a sample of a small butterfly to use as an identifier at the quilt show. I will bring that sample to the December meeting, and there may be other examples as well!

An email was distributed by our email coordinator Danielle Gagnon with the Registration Form for quilts you are entering in the show. If you have any questions about that form, don't be afraid to ask! There will be information sessions in January about how to construct a sleeve for hanging the quilt, and just before the show, how to fold and package your quilt for delivery to the Registration committee.

We may start to distribute raffle quilt tickets to members in December if we get the tickets printed in time. Otherwise, expect that you will be given books of tickets in January to sell. Sales of tickets will continue up to and including the Quilt Show days, with the draw being held at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday June 4, 2023. The raffle quilt, generously donated by Bill Stearman is a 58" X 67" in size, so around double bed size. Or generous lap/couch quilt. We will display it at one of our upcoming meetings for you to see. Tickets will be \$2 each or 3 for \$5. Please remember that this raffle quilt supports expenses for Comfort Quilts, the charitable arm of our guild. Did you know that for the Guild's 2021-2022 fiscal year (September to August) there were 116 quilts given to people in need?? Or that in 2020-2021, Comfort Quilts gave away 104 Quilts? The work of this great part of our Guild did not slow down much because of a pandemic! The money raised by the Raffle Quilt helps fund this very honourable endeavour for three years, until the next Quilt Show.



The committee members would like to wish you and your family a Merry Christmas and all the best for a safe and Happy New Year!




Diane Cichon entered her 2020 Mystery Quilt into the Norwood fair this year.



