

Serger Quilt Construction

Makes a Table-Topper 30 inches square.



**This project was designed
for 3-4 thread sergers,
with bonus features for 5-
thread serger owners.**

Supplies:

- Light fabric for triangles, squares, outer border and binding, **1.1 meter**
- Medium fabric for squares, **0.2 meter**
- Dark fabric for triangles. **0.2 meter.**
- Backing, **31-inch square**
- Batting, **31-inch square.**

Also:

Small rotary cutting mat, rotary cutter and 12-inch rotary cutting ruler.

Fine fabric marker, scissors, safety pins for basting, flat-headed pins, 4 cones of serger thread, 1 cone **fusible thread**

Plus, for 5-thread serger owners:

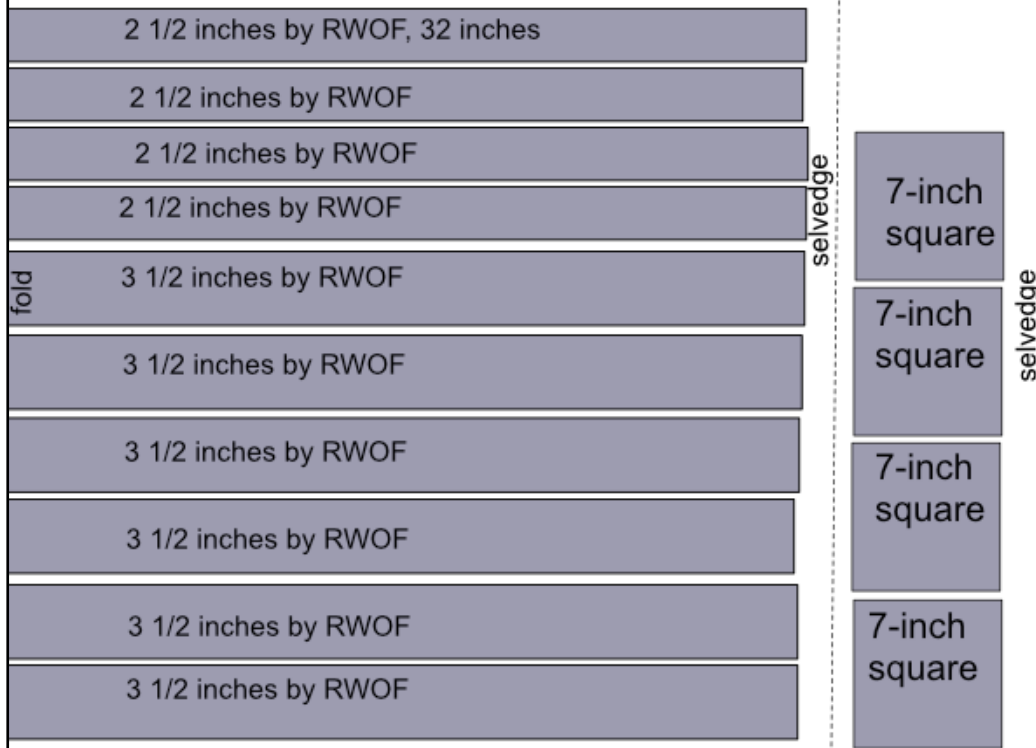
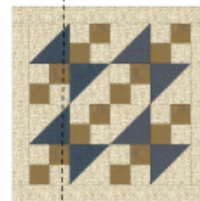
For chain-stitch: threads that match the top and the backing, clear cover-stitch foot, not a “must” but nice.

*You can use the chain stitch to quilt your table-topper (if desired) as well as top-stitch the binding.
I made the entire project on my Husqvarna/viking Amber Air S600*

Light fabric, for triangles, squares, border and binding.

Open fabric out and cut four 7-inch squares. Refold, cut six strips 3 1/2 inches wide x remaining WOF, (32") Set 4 aside for borders, Sub-cut the remaining two to four rectangles 3 1/2 inches x 15 inches.

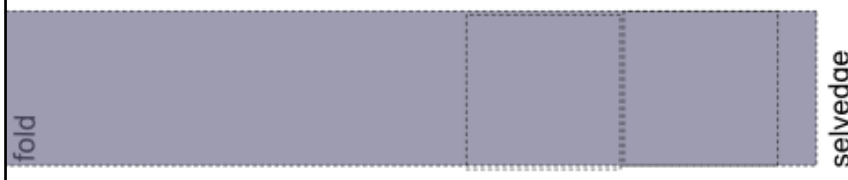
Cut four strips 2 1/2 inches x remaining WOF for binding.



Medium fabric, for squares. With fabric folded, cut two strips 3 1/2-inches x WOF. Sub cut them into 4 rectangles 3 1/2 inches x 15 inches.



Dark fabric, for triangles. With fabric folded, cut one strip 7 inches wide. Sub cut into four 7-inch squares.



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
