# Serger Quilt Construction

## **By Yvette Chilcott**

Makes a Table-Topper 30 inches square.



This project was designed for 3-4 thread sergers, with bonus features for 5thread serger owners.

#### Supplies:


- Light fabric for triangles, squares, outer border and binding, **1.1 meter**
- Medium fabric for squares, 0.2 meter
- Dark fabric for triangles.**0.2 meter.**
- Backing, **31-inch square**
- Batting, **31-inch square**.

#### Also:

Small rotary cutting mat, rotary cutter and 12-inch rotary cutting ruler.

Fine fabric marker, scissors, safety pins for basting, flat-headed pins, 4 cones of serger thread, 1 cone **fusible thread** 

### Plus, for 5-thread serger owners:



**Medium fabric**, for squares. With fabric folded, cut two strips 3 1/2-inches x WOF. Sub cut them into 4 rectangles 3 1/2 inches x 15 inches.

3 1/2 inches by WOF

3 1/2 inches by WOF

**Dark fabric**, for triangles. With fabric folded, cut one strip 7 inches wide. Sub cut into four 7-inch squares.

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For chain-stitch: threads that match the top and the backing, clear cover-stitch foot, not a "must" but nice.

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You can use the chain stitch to quilt your table-topper (if desired) as well as top-stitch the binding. I made the entire project on my Husqvarna/viking Amber Air S600
